
"Flushable" does not mean "flushable"

"Flushable" wipes are clogging sewer pipes!

Flushable wipes do not dissolve in the sewer system. Even if you only flush one, eventually wipes will collect in sewer pipes, pumps and equipment causing clogs and blockages, which may result in backups and overflows in your community or even in your own home.

Even if the package says "flushable," wipes should NEVER be flushed down the toilet. They belong in the trash.



Other things you can do to prevent Sewer Problems?

- Pour cold fats, oils and grease into a covered, disposable container and throw it into your garbage. Never pour fats, oil or grease down sink drains or toilet.
- 2. Soak up spilled oils and grease with an absorbent material such as paper towels or kitty litter and throw into your garbage.
- **3.** Before you wash dishes, scrape food scraps, fats, oils and grease into your garbage.
- 4. Use sink strainers to catch any remaining food waste while washing dishes.
- 5. When cleaning out your refrigerator throw leftover food into your garbage, not into the garbage disposal.

Improper disposal of Fats, Oils and Grease (F.O.G.) is also a major cause of sewer backups in our community. Pouring F.O.G. down your drain may cause costly backups in the sewer system and your home. Dry wipe dishes and cookware with a paper towel before washing them and dispose of F.O.G. in the trash.
