DEPARTMENT SPONSORED EVENTS

During the month of February, Largo Fire participated in 11 public events that reached approximately 2,467 people in the areas of fire safety programs, home safety preparedness programs and fall prevention. Seven smoke detectors were installed.

On Saturday, February 22nd, Largo Fire Rescue hosted their open house event, "Food Trucks and Fire Engines." The day's event brought in over 2,000 citizens and included an extrication demo, fire engine rides, station tours, and a safety presentation with a side by side burn demonstration that emphasizes the importance of home fire sprinklers, working smoke alarms and a home fire escape plan. Floribbean Fusion and Menu N Motion food trucks were on site and donated 15% of their sales to Largo Fire's donation fund, which will assist Largo citizens who have become displaced due to a home fire. Through

food truck and citizen donations, the event raised over \$2000 to assist our citizens in need

BUDGET UPDATE

For the month of February, Fire has experienced a total of 2,186 hours of overtime. Minimum staffing accounted for 1274 hours of the overtime at a cost of \$46,981.03. Special events, department committees, and training account for the remainder of the overtime assignments.
